

Safety Committee Information

In the event of a major emergency it is likely that we will be physically isolated in LWC, and that outside assistance will not be able to reach us for 2-6 weeks! While this is certainly a daunting prospect, there are steps we can all take now to make the situation more manageable.

- Know what LWC [Safety Area](#) your home is in and who your [Safety Captain](#) is
- Participate in our [LWC Community Radio Service \(CRS\)](#) by buying a two-way radio, setting it to Channel 15 and keeping it charged
- Sign up for [Lincoln County Alerts](#) for text/phone alerts of local emergencies
- Review the [72 hour checklist](#) and [Inventory of a LWC resident's go-bag](#) to help develop your go-bag in case we are instructed to evacuate
- Review [What to do when the power goes out](#) and [How to turn off gas, electric and water utilities](#)
- Check this [inventory of a LWC resident's EP cache](#)
- Prepare a file of personal papers, financial & insurance documents, contact info, CASH, etc
- Post written instructions for renters and visitors to follow if you are not here when an emergency occurs

II. During an Emergency

- **Call 911 for a personal emergency**
- Check [LWC Community Radio Service \(CRS\)](#) on Channel 15 at the top of the hour during a community-wide emergency
- Shelter in place unless directed to evacuate
