Anne Bradley - Intro: Welcome, Goal for the program, Introduce Safety Captains

John Bingham - We really do live in the Middle of Nowhere! Are you ready?

Molly Dumas - Objectives of the Safety Committee- Role of Safety Captains, what they are asked to do, what they are not expected to do.

Bill Albright - LWC Internal Communications System - network of residents who opt to own a two-way radio so they can communicate with the LWC Incident Command Center and Safety Captains without leaving the safety of their home

Dave Dumas - Shall we stay or shall we go? Shelter in Place or Evacuate?

Unique safety issues involved when using alternative methods of providing heat and light, and preparing food: portable generators, storing fuel, using fireplaces, camp stoves, etc.

Judy Maguire - Stockpiling supplies of water, non-perishable food, medications, first-aid supplies, etc.

Pets - We need a volunteer for 3-5 minutes of tips for sheltering in place with pets, good material is already on our webpage
